Support Programmes for Roko 20 Pupils



Guidance and counselling and mentorship programme


During the nine months Covid 19 break from school, most children were affected by family or parents depression, child labour and social behavior. Due to this we organized weekly boys and girls guidance and counseling programs. OpenDoors and Mugambo wa Mugikuyu radio station volunteered on this program making it successful.

As a result pupils who had faced abuse were able to open up to the counselors and we are offering support to these pupils. The Child Department and Local Administration are offering support towards the girls with serious cases.



We have introduced a Mathematics club for Class 6 and 7. As this has been a great success we will introduce the Club to other classes from Second term.

We will start a mathematics contest, coming soon...!





Computer classes

Our computers are now connected with unlimited WIFI and every one of our pupils is now able to have digital learning.

Teachers and pupils are also able to download learning materials online. The computer lessons are offered from PP1 to class 7. All classes from age 4 are involved.

We managed to locally network our 13 working desktops. This has enabled our staff and pupils to carry out their own research.

New Teachers



We have two new teachers who joined us on 22 September 2021. Joseph Guchu – class teacher grade 4 and Wesley Otieno – class teacher class 6.

General Update on Covid for Murang'a

Kenya was slow to receive new cases of the Virus however to date there are 255,469 cases reported. 5,335 deaths and 248,444 recovered cases. It is important to keep in mind that due to limited testing the actual number of cases is likely to be much higher than the number of confirmed cases (Our World in Data, 7th of December 2021).

We continue to encourage pupils and staff to wear masks and adhere to hygiene practices. Vaccinations were offered by the Government who gave a directive to all public servants to get vaccinated or face punitive action. Overall, about 13% of the population of Murang'a county are vaccinated to date (statista, 20th of November 2021).

Academic success of the school



Grade 3 sat for MLP (Monitoring Learner Progress) and all successfully completed the assessment. Our Class 7 continued to be among the top 4 schools in Gikindu zone while Class 6 moved up from position 8 to 6 in the new Term Opener exam (League table, 2nd of November 2021).

We are using the assessment and examination to gauge the pupils' performance and be able to help them improve in their weak areas. Our teachers also conducted several continuous assessment tests to evaluate pupil's achievement on the topic's contents.

School Initiatives

ICT Training for teachers

We had an ICT training for teachers. MR. Mwago is an ICT expert and has provided our teachers with vital training.

He installed software on our computers to enable coding teaching. He also taught how coding works. Virtual Zoom teaching is on the cards.

Mr Mwago also introduced some virtual teaching such as quizz.com and Kahoot.

The school encourages our pupils to carry out community services for learning purposes. We facilitate this by arranging pupil visits to the sick, elderly or becoming involved in community programmes.

Our Grade 3 were active in clearing the bush around Kambirwa water reserve basin while Grade 2 visited one elderly grandmother and donated her with rice, maize, beans and oil for the family.

Grade 3 also collected scrap metals and sold them using the proceeds to purchase classroom rulers and rubbers.

Library

We will need a space for our learners to read Storybooks quietly and a small building for storage.

School bus

Transport for pupils who live more than 5km from school is provided by our very old school van. This has broken down more times than we care to remember. Our biggest and most costliest 'wish' is to buy one that doesn't have so many years or lower mileage.

Computers and tablets

To enable smooth IT learning we will need more desktops and tablets and an educational management software program.
